NEW DECALS FOR FIRE TRUCKS IN HONOR OF CAR CRASH VICTIM Fire District, Tax Collector, and Legacy remember Logan Daily

ST. LUCIE COUNTY, FL In recognition of Burn Awareness Week (February 6-12), Legacy Donor Services Foundation (Legacy), the St. Lucie County Tax Collector's Office and the St. Lucie County Fire District are collaborating to bring attention to the need for more organ and tissue donors with an event honoring a local hero.

In October 2019, 30-year-old Logan Daily died in a car crash in Port St. Lucie. Logan was an organ donor. With his eye and tissue donation, 543 people were impacted; including six burn victims that received skin grafts.

On Monday, February 7, 2022 at 8:30 a.m. Legacy and the Tax Collector's Office will present specially designed organ donor decals to the St. Lucie County Fire District at fire station 3 (480 NW Ravenswood Lane, Port St. Lucie). These decals will be placed on all of the fire trucks throughout the county.

Logan's mother, Trina Long and his sons, Anthony (13) and Liam (9) will participate in the event by placing decals on some of the trucks.

Also in attendance will be burn survivors Demetrius Gollett, who was rescued at age eight from a house fire that claimed the lives of his great-grandparents and celebrity chef Ralph Pagano, who suffered life-threatening burns while preparing to open his restaurant on an island in the Bahamas.

"Becoming an organ donor is the last heroic act an individual can do for another human being. Countless lives are saved every year through organ donation. We are proud to participate in this event along with our tax collector's office, who has worked so diligently to expand the number of organ donors in our community."
