Sons of the American Revolution honors two St. Lucie County Firefighters

St. Lucie County, FL – The St. Lucie River Chapter of the Florida Society Sons of the American Revolution recently honored Firefighter/Engineer Jeff Lee and Deputy Chief Brian Blizzard both from the St. Lucie County Fire District.

Lee was honored for his outstanding contributions in the field of Fire Safety. Lee has been with the Fire District since February 1997. He is currently at Station #16 (in southern St. Lucie County) on the B Shift. Lee is credited with using his computer skills to help fellow firefighters and the Fire District. He worked on creating a new electronic roster to help make personnel assignments. He was nominated for his dedication and hard work. Lee currently serves as president of the International Association of Firefighters Local 1377.

Blizzard was honored for his accomplishments in the area of Emergency Medical Service. Blizzard has been with the Fire District since 1991. He currently supervises 121 line/staff personnel and 24 hour EMS/Fire operations. He supervises the Training and Safety Division, the Air Rescue Program and the Explorer Program. He chairs the Medical Review Board and the EMS Operations Committee for the Fire District. He is currently in the Executive Fire Officer (EFO) National Fire Academy program with an anticipated graduation 2013.

The Sons of the American Revolution have several chapters with 28,000 members throughout the country, all designed to inspire each local community with the principles on which the nation

was founded. Their goal is to maintain and extend the institutions of American freedom. They provide recognition for public service, including public safety officers.
