How to ICE your phone:

Type the acronym ICE into your cell phone followed by a name,
Example: ICE-Mom / ICE-Doctor

Save number under that entry

Alert the person that they are an ICE contact for you

Apply ICE sticker on your phone.

Stickers are at any St. Lucie County Fire Station.

In Case of Emergency....

So many people leave home everyday without any emergency contact information, yet they may very well carry a cell phone. Those mobile phones contain names and numbers of contacts, but the owner is typically the only one to know which of these numbers belong to family and friends.

If you were involved in an accident, became ill, or were otherwise involved in a medical emergency, the people attending you would have access to your mobile phone but they wouldn't know who to call.

In Case of Emergency (ICE) is a program that enables first responders (firefighters, EMTs, paramedics, and police officers) and hospital staff to contact a responsible person who can relay and accept information about you in an emergency situation.

The program was conceived around 2005 and promoted by a British paramedic. It encourages people to enter emergency contacts in their cell phone address book with the prefix "ICE." The popularity of the program has spread across Europe and is growing in North America.
